Case #1

25/F

- 2 day epigastric pain radiating to the RLQ
- □ (+) fever
- □ (+) vomiting
- (+) flank pain

RLQ direct tenderness
no rebound tenderness
No CVA tenderness

What is lacking???

HISTORY

- LMP? 2weeks ago
- Inguinal pain? none
- Persistent pain? yes
- Anorexia? yes
- Fever timing?- after the pain
- Rovsings?
 Psoas?
 Cough sign?
 Obturator?

PE

Differential Diagnosis

PUD UTI Urolithiasis Intestinal Colic Ovarian cyst Acute appendicitis

What would you order?

CBC – WBC 13


- Urinalysis pus cells 10-12
- Pregnancy test negative
- Ultrasound negative
- CT scan
- Diagnostic laparoscopy

ACUTE APPENDICITIS

Management

- Serial abdominal examination
- Preoperative antibioticsHydration
- appendectomy







Case #2

- □ Case #1 patient
- 6 hr delay in surgery
- Generalized abdominal pain and fever
- tachypnea

 Generalized tenderness
 Rebound and direct tenderness
 febrile

Case #3

- **64/M**
- 6 year reducible R inguinoscrotal mass
 Painful inguinal bulge

5cm R inguinoscrotal bulge
Slightly tender scrotum
No fever

What is lacking???

HISTORY

- Occupation?
- Duration of irreducible mass?
- Bowel symptoms?

Abdominal examination?Transillumination?

PE

Differential Diagnosis

Orchitis

- Testicular torsion
- Scrotal abscess
- Testicular cancer
- Urolithiasis
- Incarcerated inguinal hernia

What would you order?

CBC – WBC 14
Urinalysis – wbc 2-3, rbc 2-3
Scrotal ultrasound

INCARCERATED INGUINAL HERNIA

Management

Hydration

- Antibiotics
- Inguinal exploration, reduction of bowels, mesh herniorrrhaphy







Case #4

- Case #3 patient12 hr delay in surgery
- Generalized abdominal pain
- Generalized abdominal tenderness
 febrile

INCARCERATED HERNIA → STRANGULATED HERNIA





Case #5

- 58/M, hypertensive
- 2 yr history of epigastric pain
- 1 hr generalised abdominal pain
- □ (-) fever

Generalized tenderness
(+) hypotension
tachycardia

What is lacking???

HISTORY

- Timing and duration of abdominal pain?
- Vomiting?? Hematemesis??
- Dietary habits?
- Vices??
- Weight loss
- Cardiovascular history

Murphy's??DRE?

PE

Differential Diagnosis

- Calculous cholecystitis
- Pancreatitis
- Gastric cancer
- Mesenteric ischemia
 Intestinal perforation
 Myocardial Infarction

What would you order?

- Amylase/lipase
- **CBC**
- Ultrasound
- CT scan
- 12L ECG, cardiac enzymes
- Chest X-ray

Management

Hydration
Antibiotics
EL, omental patching





Case #6

56/M

- 2 month history of decreasing caliber of stools
- Sudden abdominal distention
- (+) vomiting
 No BM/flatus x 2 days

Distended sl tender abdomen, all quadrants
Hyperactive BS
Collapsed rectal vault
(-) fever

What is lacking???

HISTORY

Weight loss?
LGIB/UGIB??
Previous surgeries?

PEFluid wave?Abdominal masses?

Differential Diagnosis

- Pancreatitis
- Ascites 2???
- Ruptured appendicitis
- Intestinal perforation
- Intestinal cancer
- Intestinal obstruction

What would you order?

- Plain abdomen upright and supine
- Colonoscopy
- Abdominal CT Scan
- **CBC**
- Ultrasound
- Chest X-ray PA



COMPLETE GUT OBSTRUCTION



- Colonoscopy
- Medical decompression
- Antibiotics
- Exploratory laparotomy

UPPER GI/LOWER GI BLEEDING

Differential Diagnosis for UGIB/LGIB

UGIB

- Esophageal varices
- Gastric/duodenal ulcers
- Gastric CA
- Dieulafoy's lesion
- Mallory Weis tears

LGIB
Hemorrhoids
Polyps
Colorectal CA
Angiodysplasia
Diverticulosis
Massive UGIB

Management of UGIB/LGIB

UGIB

- Fluid resuscitation
- Localization of bleeding site


EGD

- Endoscopic control of bleeding
- EL, ligation of bleeders/gastrectomy

LGIB


- Fluid Resuscitation
- Localization of bleeding site
- Colonoscopy
- Endoscopic control of bleeding
- EL, total colectomy

UGI Bleeding






THORACOABDOMINAL PERFORATING INJURIES

Penetrating Thoracic Injuries

Chest P.E
Duration of Injury
Hemodynamic Instability
Mechanism of Injury







- ABC's
- Chest X-ray
- Subxiphoid Ultrasound
- CTT insertion
- Thoracotomy
- Thoracentesis/pericardiotomy

Penetrating Abdominal Injuries

- Abdominal P.E
- Duration of Injury
- Hemodynamic Instability
- Mechanism of Injury



Management

□ ABC's

- Chest X-ray PA upright
- Abdominal X-rays
- **FAST**
- CT-Scan
- DPL
- Exploratory Surgery
