Clinical Abstract

- 8 year old girl
- Chief Complaint: headache
- History of Present Illness:
 - November 2015 3 months PTA intermittent headache brought to optometrist and given prescription lenses
 - December 2015 2 months PTA noted head tilt to the R
 - January 2016 1 month PTA difficulty in walking
 - February 2016 2 days PTA vomiting

Physical Examination

- Wt: 24 kg Length: 124cm
- BP: 130/90 HR: 110/min RR: 16/min

T: 36C

- Head: normocephalic
- Chest: no retraction, clear breath sounds
- Heart: regular rhythm, no murmur
- Abdomen: no organomegaly
- Extremities: full pulses

Neurologic Examination

- Mental Status: Drowsy, does not open eyes to name calling, opens eyes and moans briefly to pain, withdraws extremity to pain
- Cranial nerves:
 - Vision: cannot be assessed, grade 2 papilledema
 - Isocoric reactive pupils
 - Limited eye movement on doll's eye maneuver
 - + corneal reflex bilaterally
 - No facial asymmetry
 - Gag reflex deferred evaluation

Neurologic Examination

- Sensory/Motor: withdraws both limbs to pain
- Cerebellars: cannot be assessed
- Supple neck
- DTRs: increased at the knee joints
- Babinski: bilateral upgoing toes, bilateral clonus
