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#### **CONDUCT OF CLASS**

- 1. The course will utilize the UP Manila Virtual Learning Environment (VLE). - 2. The typical week in the course starts on a Thursday. Instructions and links to educational materials and/or activities related to each session will be provided. Students are encouraged to explore other resources regarding the topics to maximize learning.
- 3. Weekly tasks with instructions will be posted for each session. Submission deadlines will be reasonably flexible. Requirements during the course of the semester will be used towards the capstone project of a Final Research Paper that has been defended to an Experts Panel, and the final copy approved by the Research Adviser and the Dent197 faculty.
  - You are advised to stick to the target dates in completing the tasks to pace yourselves during the semester. Do take into consideration of tasks that need to be accomplished as a group and tasks that need to be completed immediately (those tagged as "Expected to be completed on...").
- 4. Students will continue to work on their research project initiated during Dentistry 199 [2<sup>nd</sup> Semester of Fifth Year] until Dentistry 197 [2<sup>nd</sup> Semester of Sixth Year]. Change of topics must be done in coordination with the Research Adviser and must be communicated with the course coordinator.

Online rooms for Final Paper Presentations will be created and hosted by the presenting Research Group.

- 6. Observe proper netiquette during online sessions.

Students are projected to maximize engagement with their Research Advisers (e.g. obtaining institutional approval of their research proposal, collaborating in implementing their research, coordinating their research presentation schedule, preparing the Final Paper for submission, etc.). Your Research Adviser must be adequately informed about your research activities. Requirements submitted and uploaded via VLE must also be e-mailed to your Research Adviser and CC'd to mfmendoza3@up.edu.ph. Pertinent correspondences regarding research activities must include the entire research team.
- 8. Students are expected to consult with other faculty aside from their Research Adviser. Experts from the field of the chosen research topic must be <u>actively sought for inputs</u> in finishing their research project.
- 9. When files or documents need to be submitted, follow the prescribed filename protocol and send/upload the course requirements using the format:

- 10. Attendance will not be checked but participation will be expected during synchronous sessions and activities. Non-presenting students are encouraged to attend the Final Paper Presentations of other groups to maximize learning in the course.
