Introduction:

By this time, you have studied about the basic concepts in mental health psychiatric nursing. As student nurses, you already know that the therapeutic communication and the therapeutic use of self is an integral part of the whole nurse-patient relationship and the nursing process. As you begin to prepare with your nursing care for clients with mental health needs, you must keep in mind the important components of psychiatric nursing assessment. Let's start!
