

Health is defined by the WHO as a "state of complete physical, psychological and social well being and not merely the absence of disease or infirmity". With such a definition, factors affecting health are many and complex. These factors are occurring not only in the present but also conditions that have existed in the past among our parents and ancestors but have been passed on to their offsprings until the present generation. This makes anthropology, which is the study of human beings and their ancestors through time and space and in relation to physical character, environmental and social relations, and culture, very important to understand human behavior in health and illness.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

- Describe components of Filipino culture based on important life events and the dynamics of individuals, families, population groups and communities;
- 7. Discuss the dynamics of being a human person and a Filipino amidst urbanization, globalization, technological advancement, modernization, and the challenges of the world today; and
- 8. Apply anthropological perspectives in understanding one's own culture and behavior, and as a member of family, population group, and community.
