Thoroughly inspects the patient's body, especially arms and legs, for the presence of self-mutilation marks; makes a plan for wound care, if applicable	4	
If the patient is female, ask about pregnancy and/or date of last menstrual period. If the patient does not know or suspects that she might be pregnant, informs the patient's treating clinician that a pregnancy test should be ordered	1	
Asks about the patient's experience with psychotherapy and what other interventions/treatments the treating clinician has prescribed, including strategies to reduce BPD-related behaviors and promote healthy behaviors	1	
Asks if the patient has a contract and/or safety plan with the treating clinician and if he/she will tell you what the contract and safety plan involve	4	
Encourages discussion regarding the challenges of changing behavior and what strategies help the patient to successfully change behavior	4	
Maintains a nonjudgmental, unemotional attitude during all communication with the patient	2	
Collaborates with other members of the multidisciplinary care team to implement methods for identifying triggers for borderline-related behaviors and formulating appropriate responses/treatments to lessen their effects	2
