I. Drafts 1 and 2 (Pre-defense)

Draft 1 deadline: 10 May 2024, 11:59 PM

A. Documents to submit

- 1. Title page, Chapters I to VI, Reference list in Word and PDF
- 2. Turnitin report the full report

B. Preliminary assessment

- 2. Your first draft undergoes a non-graded preliminary assessment. The goal is to determine if the output is defense ready.
- 3. You will receive a written evaluation which must be incorporated in your draft 2.
- 4. The evaluation form shows two evaluation results:
 - Pass You may proceed to the defense.
 - Fail You must revise the manuscript until it is satisfactory.

C. Thesis defense

- While waiting for your evaluation, you may contact your critic of choice.
 Tentatively schedule your defense 7 working days from your draft 1 submission.
- 2. Allot 1 hour for the thesis defense schedule.
- 3. Submit the following no less than 5 days before your defense. If you cannot, ask your critic if you can submit them closer to the defense.
 - Draft 2 Abstract, main chapters, reference

II. Draft 3 (Post-defense)

Draft 1 deadline: 30 May 2024, 11:59 PM

A. Document to submit

- 1. Submit draft 3 as a full-dress manuscript, complete with the front matter, main chapters, and back matter.
- 2. Draft 3 must include the critic's evaluation.

B. Assessment

- 1. Draft 3 is awarded a numerical grade, which is also your final grade for ORCOM 200. The grade is broken down as follows:
 - Critic's grade based on the defense and draft 2 50%
 - Adviser's grade based on draft 3 50%
- 2. Your draft 3 will be returned to you with additional comments if necessary. At this stage, your adviser may also make direct edits on your manuscript.
- 3. Draft 4, the final manuscript, is the copy you will submit to DAC and the library for archiving.
