First Long Examination Primer

- I. The examination shall take place on **October 1, 2024, Tuesday**, at **Room 4-1**, **UP College of Dentistry**. To get to the examination location, take the UPCD elevator and upon reaching the Fourth Floor, **turn left**. The room is visibly labeled as **4-1**.
- II. Exam coverage is as follows:

•	Community Diagnosis	25%
•	Demography	25%
•	Vital and Health Statistics	25%
•	Epidemiology	25%

The exam is equivalent to **15%** of your final grade in N-119.

- III. Report to the exam room by 1:00 PM. Be punctual. Late examinees will not be given additional time to complete the 2-hour exam. **No one will be allowed to exit the room once entered.** Talking to another examinee is not allowed when inside the exam room.
- IV. Wear your official UP ID and present this to the examiner during attendance check.
- V. You are only allowed to bring the following to your seat:
 - Ballpens with BLACK ink only
 - One (1) piece of long folder: Write your name on the side dedicated for labeling with FAMILY NAME, Given Name M.I. format (e.g. DELA CRUZ, Juan A.). Write your student number below your name. Make sure that your writing is legible. No erasures. Use this to cover your exam sheets during the examination and submission of your exam papers after the exam.
 - Scientific calculator

Borrowing of these materials from other examinees is not allowed.

- VI. The following are prohibited in your examination area:
 - Books, notes, review materials, and other printed materials
 - Formula sheets (Note: A formula sheet is attached to the exam sheets. However, you are expected to have understood the formulas discussed in order for you to answer the questions correctly.)
 - Cellular phones and other electronic gadgets / devices

Bags and other personal belongings should be left at the area designated by the examiner. Do not bring valuables. Personal belongings brought by an examinee shall be for their own account. UPCN will not be answerable for any such item or personal belonging that might be lost during the exam without fault or negligence on its part.

- VII. Examinees shall be restricted to one (1) assigned seat. Form a line outside the room following the instructions of the examiner. Maintain silence while waiting for your turn to enter the room. Once examinees begin to enter, talking to another examinee is not allowed.
- VIII. Eating and drinking are not allowed.
- IX. You are not to leave the exam room once you enter, until you submit your long folders. Ensure that you have eaten your lunch and have used the washroom before starting the examination to avoid leaving the exam area.
- X. During the examination:
 - You are not allowed to communicate by any means.
 - You are not allowed to copy, record, and/or reproduce any part of the exam.
 - Should you need anything or have any urgent concern or queries during the exam, prompt the assigned proctor by raising your right hand.
 - Read and follow instructions carefully. **Question types may vary** (e.g. multiple choice, brief answer, computation, interpretation).
 - You will answer directly on the given exam sheets. No separate shading sheet.
 No extra sheet. Write your answers on the blanks, boxes, and spaces provided for each question.
 - When asked to write the letter corresponding to your answer, use capital letters only.
 - Write legibly. Avoid erasures.
 - University of the Philippines and/or College of Nursing rules apply on issues of misconduct and/or academic/intellectual dishonesty, cheating, etc.
- XI. After the examination:
 - The examination should be done within 2 hours. You may finish the examination at an earlier time.
 - After answering all items of the exam, put your exam sheets inside your folder.
 - You are not allowed to discuss any part and all parts of the exam to anyone.
 Maintain the confidentiality of the exam.
 - Once all examinees are done taking the exam, quietly return to the room. The remaining time in the afternoon shall be allotted for section discussions and consultations with your faculty on your Data Collection Plan and Seminar.
- XII. To reiterate the guidelines stated in the course guide given to you and explained during the course orientation:
 - O The minimum passing score per examination is **60%**.
 - O A student who has a failing mark per examination (below 60%) can take a **reexamination** of the failed long examination/s (to be taken immediately after its schedule). Passing this (at least 60%) gives the student a score of 60% for the respective previously failed examination/s.
 - O In case the student receives a failing mark (below 60%) in the reexamination, a removal exam can be taken. If passed (at least 60%), the student receives a score of 60%. If failed (below 60%), the score received shall be inputted as it is and shall be part of the computation for the final course grade.
 - O All reexaminations and removal exams shall consist of a *new set of questions*.
 - O Students are advised not to miss any exam. Make-up examinations will not be given, unless there is an excused absence. *University rule on absence shall apply.*
