Introduction

Population aging has become a significant societal transformation of the 21st century drawing implications in all sectors of society including labor and demand for goods and services (transportation, housing, social welfare protection, living arrangements). Although the aging phenomenon in the Philippines is comparatively slower than neighboring countries in the Southeast Asian region at 8.6% in 2019 of the total population, policies must be in place to ensure integrated care for older adults early on in life.

This module identifies individual characteristics and living arrangements of older adults in the Philippines and globally, the factors affecting population aging, common issues and challenges faced by older adults, and implications to health and society of an aging population.
