Group Reporting

Objective:

To enhance students' understanding of mental health issues across different population groups, including risk factors, common mental health conditions, interventions, and community-based approaches to care.

Instructions:

1. Group Assignment:

- The class will be divided into 4 groups, each assigned a specific population group. Please see groupings below.
- Population groups:
 - Group 1- Children and Adolescents
 - Group 2- Older Adults
 - Group 3- LGBTQ+ Community
 - Group 4- Persons with Substance Use Disorders

2. Research and Preparation:

- Each group will conduct research on their assigned population group, covering:
 - Prevalence and common mental health conditions
 - Risk factors and protective factors
 - Cultural and societal influences on mental health
 - Available community-based interventions and programs
 - Challenges and barriers to mental health care
- Groups must integrate evidence-based resources and policies relevant to the Philippine context.

3. Presentation Format:

- Each group will have **15–20 minutes** to present their findings.
- Presentations should be **interactive** and use a mix of methods such as:
 - PowerPoint slides
 - Case studies
 - Short video clips
 - Role-playing or skits
 - Audience participation activities
- A **5-minute Q&A session** will follow each presentation.

4. Discussion and Reflection:

- After all groups have presented, a class-wide discussion will be facilitated to compare the mental health needs of different populations.
- Reflection questions:



- What are the key similarities and differences across population groups?
- How can nurses advocate for equitable mental health care?
- What role do community health programs play in addressing mental health disparities?

5. Evaluation Criteria:

- **Content (40%)** – Depth and accuracy of research, relevance to the Philippine context
- **Engagement (20%)** – Creativity and effectiveness of presentation methods
- **Critical Analysis (20%)** – Ability to analyze issues and propose solutions
- **Collaboration (10%)** – Teamwork and coordination among group members
- **Q&A and Discussion (10%)** – Ability to respond to questions and engage the audience
