Guidelines for Community Rotation

- I. Reiteration of Related Aspects in Course Guide
 - 1. This component is equivalent to 1.5 units of this course. Evaluation shall be based on the <u>Performance Evaluation Checklist</u> (please open the link), with a minimum passing score of 141 / 235 (equivalent to 3.0).

- 2. Community rotation shall be from 7:00 AM to 11:00 AM, from Monday to Friday. University rule on attendance and absence shall apply.
 - a. Students shall come to all scheduled community rotation activities **promptly**.
 - b. A student is considered late if arrival is **1 to 15 minutes** after the designated time of community rotation.
 - c. A student is considered absent if arrival is **more than 15 minutes** after the designated time of all scheduled activities.
 - d. Three (3) incidences of tardiness (consecutive or not) during all academic activities are also equivalent to **one (1) unexcused absence**.
 - e. Students who are absent (excused or unexcused) for 20% or more of the community rotation (equivalent to 4 days of absences or more) will be given a final grade of 5.0 for this course. Reenrollment of the entire course shall be done next Academic Year.
 - f. Be guided by the course schedule. *Refrain from planning vacations or travels within the course schedule.* Requests to be excused shall not be entertained.
- 3. The following are strictly **NOT allowed** and will be sanctioned based on the implementing rules reflected on the UPCN Catalogue of Information, Student Handbook, and UP Manual:
 - a. Intellectual or academic dishonesty, cheating, plagiarism, or misconduct
 - b. Video recording, voice recording, or photography, of any kind, of any activities, unless properly consented
 - c. Accessing or sharing any confidential data beyond agreed contract with the clients, the student, and the faculty
 - d. Any form of malicious, disrespectful, or insensitive posting, sharing, or communicating of any course-related information
 - e. Any form of social media posting that may violate patients' rights, privacy, and confidentiality
 - f. Discussion of client data outside academic venues and sessions

- g. Granting of access to shared drives, folders, files to people outside the respective student-in-charge and their faculty

II. Specific Guidelines for N-12

- 1. Each student shall look for and provide nursing care to 2 beginning families.
 - a. Limit to 1 barangay under the assigned health center; barangay is selected in coordination with the physician-in-charge
 - b. Nuclear, with 3 to 5 members only
 - c. With couples aged 18 to 35
 - d. With children aged 0 to 10
 - e. Integrating concepts and concerns from previous courses (e.g. nutrition, parasitism, family planning) and Maternal and Child Nursing; not those in succeeding N105 and N107 courses (e.g. hypertension (even undiagnosed), tuberculosis, diabetes, psychological/psychiatric conditions, developmental problems such as autism)

- f. Preferred to have a pregnant woman (but not high risk pregnancy), newborn, 0-5 child, school age child, adolescent (up to 10 years old only)
- g. No maintenance medications such as given to long-term or chronic conditions
- 2. Requirements (please open the link) shall include:
 - a. Assessment Database
 - b. Problem Sheet
 - c. Priority Setting
 - d. Family Nursing Care Plan (for priority problems)
 - e. implementation materials
 - f. service and progress notes of the Family Service and Progress Record (IV of Appendix C2)
 - g. filled out Performance Evaluation Checklist

These shall be submitted to a **Google Drive folder created by each group's faculty-in-charge**.

- 3. Practice safeguarding clients' **data privacy**. Secure informed consent: Pahintulot ng Pamilya (please open the link). Keep the signed document. Place a scanned copy inside your Google Drive folder.
- 4. Students shall closely coordinate with their respective faculty-in-charge for their consultation hours.

III. Other Guidelines for Fieldwork

- 1. Students are expected to demonstrate **proper decorum** at all times. **Respect** shall be shown in relating with their clients, the members of their group, and their faculty, as well as with members and leaders of the health center, barangay, and community.
- 2. Students shall wear their **Public Health Nursing uniform** during fieldwork, along with their **ID** and nameplate. Avoid using **expensive jewelries**, **cell phones**, and other **gadgets** while in the community. Students must wear **face masks** and practice **proper hand hygiene**.
- 3. Students are **discouraged to go around the community alone**. For safety and security reasons, they shall be in *groups or pairs*.
 - a. Students are advised to **take extra precautions** to take care of themselves, their members, and their personal belongings.
 - b. Students shall also **take extra precautions in commuting** to and from their fieldwork areas.
- 4. In the event students would need to go to the community on other days or time frames (e.g. during weekends, during weekday afternoons), **independent fieldwork** may be allowed, as long as:
 - a. A letter (addressed to the faculty-in-charge, *indicating details of fieldwork and how to ensure safety and security*) is submitted to the faculty-in-charge
 - b. Coordination (upon arriving and before leaving) is made with the clients and their respective barangay leaders
 - c. They will not be in the area beyond 4:00 PM
 - d. They will take responsibility for the safety and security of every member

- 5. For safety, students are **discouraged from buying and consuming food products** sold in the area (e.g. outside establishments, where sanitary practices may not be ensured).
- 6. Students are highly encouraged to **bring only the most essential items** for their fieldwork.
 - a. Refrain from bringing big and heavy bags, as well as expensive and valuable items.
 - b. Protection from rain and possible flood is advised to be brought as necessary.
 - c. Bring an umbrella and personal water bottle, as you deem necessary.
- 7. Students are prohibited from engaging in **non-productive activities** (e.g. playing cards, playing games, watching television, watching movies) during duty hours.
- 8. Parents, relatives, friends, guests, and students from other courses and year levels are **NOT allowed to visit nor join** N-12 students during fieldwork. This is to maintain their professional image and disposition.
- 9. In case of illness or emergency, particularly when in the community, students shall **immediately notify** their respective faculty-in-charge. In case of class suspensions, the course shall abide by declarations from the University and the local government.
- 10. Students are highly encouraged to take extra care of themselves and their overall health and wellbeing. Students are advised to not skip meals, to take vitamins, and to find time to have adequate rest and relaxation. Raise any concerns or needs to the faculty.
